More than 400,000 people have died in the 4-year conflict in Darfur.

More than 2.5 million people have been displaced from their homes.

Murder, rape, pillage and mass forced displacement continue to be used as weapons of war by government-supported Janjawid militias, the Sudanese armed forces and opposition forces as well.
